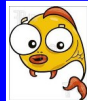

Parent help is most welcome, Please let Maria or Belinda know if you are interested in joining us.

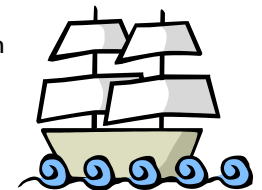
